Glossary

Golf Terms

Ace: A hole-in-one. Hitting the ball into the hole in one stroke.

Birdie: 1 stroke under par Bogey: 1 stroke over par

Bunker: (a hazard) usually a hole of sand Caddie: the person who carries a golfer's clubs

Double Bogey: 2 strokes over par

Drive: a golfer's first stroke from the tee box on every hole

Eagle: 2 strokes under par

Fore!: A warning shouted when the ball is heading toward a person or object Fairway: A long stretch involving a neatly maintained grass which runs between

the green and the tee box

Green: The smooth grassy area at the end of a fairway prepared for putting

Handicap: A system used to rate the average number of strokes above par a player scores in one round of golf.

Hazard: Anything on a golf course that is designed to be hazardous to one's score Mulligan: A second chance (do-over) to perform an action, usually after the first chance went wrong through bad luck or a blunder

Par: The number of strokes a golfer is expected to need to complete the play of one hole on a golf course

Rough: The taller grass that borders the fairway
